<sup>1</sup> The king, formerly supposed to be Ramessu X, is now known to be Si-ptah of Dynasty XIX (H.R. Hall, "Anc. Hist. Near East," p. 389, footnote 2). The last Ramessu of Dynasty XX is therefore Ramessu XI, instead of Ramessu XII as formerly supposed.

<sup>2</sup> Here we have 38 kings in dominant succession- the number in Manetho (Version Eusebius) for Dynasties XX to XXVI inclusive.

\* Sheshag II., originally a powerful chief of Libyan mercenaries under the XXIst Dynasty - and descended from a long line of Libyan chiefs, who had settled at Heracleopolis early in the XXIst Dynasty - became petty king in the Delta, by extending his rule over Bubastis, before he actually became king of all Egypt in 967 B.C. (refer Breasted's **Records IV**, 788 and footnote C; also his "**Hist. Egypt**," p. 558.
